## Surge protector 101 - Why you need one.

#### What is a surge and what is a spike?

A surge may be called a high voltage condition that lasts well beyond a nano or milliseconds or a even a second. It could be a doubling of the line voltage. A number of things can cause a surge and the most common is a failure in the utility system. Auto accidents and trees that disturb power lines are the most common causes. I would also add low voltage can be just as damaging as high voltage. Both high and low voltage changes can happen when they system is abruptly loaded or unloaded. An example might be when a neighborhood is re-energized after an outage. Dimming lights when the AC starts is a sign of lower voltage.

A spike is more characterized as a very fast spark on the line that last a very short time and if it could be measured could be thousands of volts capable of jumping a air gap. A spike may also be a high frequency event not related to the standard 60 hertz on the line. Spikes are more likely to be caused by arcing of power lines and associated equipment. We can also cause an arc every time we switch on a load. Lightning is the most damaging type of spark due to its extreme high voltage and current potential. A direct strike is not necessary as static in the air can be picked up by the wires. Protection against a surge (high or low voltage) is different than against a spike and you really need to protect against both.

An RV may be more susceptible to damage than a home because it is not as grounded as well as a home. The ground is at the end of a wire and plug. A home or a couple of homes probably has 1 transformer that feeds it. That transformer provides a degree of isolation from the rest of the system. In a RV park your sharing the same circuit with a whole bunch of other RVs.

RVs have another distinct problem, they are plugged in. Plugs and sockets wear out. We also shake, vibrate and flex the whole RV causing connections to become loose. A loose connection will get hot (melt), arc (causing spikes) and the result will be low voltage. Our breaker boxes and system operate closer to limits compared to a house.

Here is what to look for when buying a protective device for your RV. First I must say I am not recommending a company and have no financial interest in the industry.

There are things to look for.

- 1. Protection against spikes
- 2. Protection from surges, aka high or low voltage.
- 3. Proper wiring configuration of the supply socket.
- 4. Automatic disconnection
- 5. Line voltage adjustment.

Since the public needs a simple word and marketing is... marketing, nearly every device is labeled a "surge protector". But we are smarter about this.

- 1. Spike Nearly all so called surge protection devices advertised protects against spikes. The protection part is called a MOV (Metal Oxide Varistor). Look it up to learn more. It works by shorting out the line to limit the spike energy from affecting your devises. The MOV absorbs the energy and has a very limited ability to do this. A spike of a very high voltage example 10,000 volts that last a nano second can be stopped. But if you exceed the rating it will simply blow out and allow that spike into your system. They may pop so fast a fuse or breaker will fail to pop. The other problem with these parts are they wear out and you will not know it unless there is a monitoring circuit. MOV's are rated in Joules, the more the better. A better unit will tell you they protect line to line and line to ground so they have several MOVs. MOVs will protect all spikes that are created by your neighbors, the utility and your own devises within limits. Beware a lightning spike will exceed the MOV rating so this is not a perfect and does not solve all problems.
- 2. Surges Our electronic devices operate on a range of voltages more typically 108 127 volts with a preferred range of 114 to 126 volts. A good protection device will monitor the voltage and disconnect when this range is exceeded. Some will allow you to adjust the range. Some will delay the initial connection and provide a reconnect delay to make sure the voltage is stable. If your having issues the most likely problem is a loose connection causing a low voltage.
- 3. Because we are plugged in and we wear out the socket and because the local untrained maintenance guy at the RV park replaced the socket last, there is a chance wiring can be miss wired or broken. A good protection device will have indicators that show you the circuit is good before you plug in the RV.
- 4. Some devices will monitor the voltage and when it falls outside specifications will automatically disconnect the RV.

Most people think about a protection device that plugs into the RV power pedestal and that is the simplest and easiest to use but we do have one more issue to address, the generator can also provide low and high voltage and can also fail to provide exactly 60 hertz frequency. There are a number of hard wired devices that can protect the entire RV even when using the generator.

For your most sensitive electronic devices like computers and TV's consider buying a UPS (uninterruptible power supply). They can be found at computer stores and they do a great job of disconnecting you anytime the power falls outside set limits.

Power spikes and especially lightning can also affect 12 volt DC devices as these spikes can soak through everything. The very best protection is to disconnect from the grid during a storm, actually unplug. Once you see a blackened breaker box you realize that having the switch off was not enough. Its time to exercise your battery system and enjoy.

There is one other type of protection device. This one actually adjusts the line voltage when it is low. I am only aware of one such product made for RV's. It contains a transformer and has spike protection.



## **FMCA**

FMCA Bylaws Amendments passed during the Governing Board meeting are now in effect for Bylaws Article I, FMCA Mission and Purpose. You can review the updated document at FMCA.com: <a href="https://www.fmca.com/pdfs/Document-FMCAByLaws.pdf">https://www.fmca.com/pdfs/Document-FMCAByLaws.pdf</a>

**FMCA's 108th International Convention and RV Expo**. Please mark your calendars for FMCA's 108th International Convention and RV Expo, "Fiesta Del Sol," scheduled to take place March 20-23, 2024, in Tucson, Arizona.

Looks like FMCA is moving away from AT&T hotspots and going back to T-Mobile. There will be two parts of the T-Mobile contract. The hotspot plan is as follows:

Unlimited data, with network management in congested areas after 100 GB of usage. There are two options for devices. Members may pay the one-time rental fee for a 5G hotspot or bring their own device without the rental fee. It comes with 5 GB of data per month in Mexico or Canada. Wireless priority service provides top access to carrier towers in congested areas with high level connection. It was stated the pricing is like the AT&T plan, with a one-time \$39.99 rental fee and the monthly service fee of \$59.99.ctly from the carrier. It will take 4-6 weeks to get the T-Mobile program up and running.

It was also stated that this is the first time FMCA has been able to offer voice plans. The voice plan includes unlimited talk and text in the United States, Mexico, and Canada. Data network management occurs in congested areas after 50 GB of usage. Chris mentioned that this is a "bring your own device" plan, and no phones currently are offered with it. However, phones and accessories will be available for purchase. T-Mobile will be handling the entire shipping process for SIM cards. Members will receive the SIM card in the mail to activate service, and clear instructions will be provided. The plan will include 2 GB of data in Mexico and Canada and 5 GB of mobile hotspot data. Wireless priority service applies to the voice plans as well.

Please note that FMCA has a new partner on the Tech Connect side. Hyperion will handle hosting, the order portal, can bill members, will pay the carrier bills on behalf of FMCA, and can accept ACH payment. This will decrease credit card fees. Chris stated this will take the burden off FMCA, for both hotspot and voice plans. There is no monthly device management fee. It was noted the Hyperion is compensated on SPIFF money directly from the carrier. It will take 4-6 weeks to get the T-Mobile program up and running.

#### Stop 1 ( Niagara Falls, NY):

If you don't have a passport or passport card, this might be a great time to get one, as there are plenty of experiences to discover both on the US and Canadian side of the Falls. And in order to cross the border, you will need an valid passport. 6 nights

#### Stop 2 (Alexandria Bay, NY):

We depart Niagara Falls on Aug 29 and travel 243 miles up to Swan Bay Resort in Alexanderia Bay, NY where we will stay through the Labor Day weekend. You are in for a 4-day excursion along shores of the breathtaking St Lawrence River in what is known as the Thousand Islands. here are so many different experiences in the area from Wineriers to Castles, to Antique boats, to Blues in the Bay. Our group will embark together for the "Two Nation" boat tour on the St Lawrence River including a lunch cruise and castle tour. 5 nights
